Yemin Orde Youth Village remained opened during Israel's Covid-19 lockdown for its youth with no other home in Israel or who cannot return safely to challenging home environments. Today, all youth have returned to the Village but classes, dining situations and home environments operate within strict health and safety protocols. Village graduates who experience financial hardship because of the pandemic receive financial assistance and emotional support.

Village Way Educational Initiatives and its team of facilitators provided remote learning materials and guidance to thousands of educators during Israel's lockdowns who, in turn, remained connected to their isolated students. ###
